INTRODUCTION

Living in London, one of the most vibrant cities in the world, brings a wealth of opportunities. There are over 1.1 million businesses in the capital, representing nearly a third of all businesses in the UK. But even with so many potential employers at hand, it can still be difficult to find and secure the perfect work placement. The successful candidate will need to have considered early planning and action, speculative applications, networking, and be persistence even in the face of rejection.

The keys to your success are:

- 1. Start early (there are over 4.6 million 16-year olds in the UK)
- 2. Choose some areas of interests (but don not be too specific)
- 3. Research available placements online (use search engines and sites like <u>Student Ladder</u>)
- 4. Approach potential employers by email, letter, speculative application (as required on their website)
- 5. Network (approach parents, friends, neighbours, LinkedIn etc.)

Be aware that some types of work experience are very difficult to get because of workplace restrictions, confidentiality, and health and safety regulations. You might need to find work experience in areas that are closely related to your preferred field rather than directly in them.

Why complete work experience?

Work experience is a great way to explore the careers and industries that interest you, to see if they really do match your expectations and to discover the academic and personal skills required to pursue them. It will also help you identify your natural aptitudes and those skills you will need to develop, including transferable skills such as good communication, teamwork, problem solving, motivation, and time management.

Completing work experience will help you make an informed decision about your future and provide you with the extra motivation you need to succeed in examinations. It will help you build you CV and may even give you the chance to be offered a summer job in the future.

How do I know which work experience placement to apply for?

First think about the academic subjects you enjoy the most at school, your interests outside of school and the type of career you might be interested in.

Once you have compiled a list look at the different sectors in each field and narrow down your options by using the resources available to you in the Library, on Firefly, and in this document. You might even want to have a chat with the Director of Careers, Mr Bossé – just send him an email to arrange an appointment.

You may also wish to visit a company called <u>Career Ready</u>, who provide <u>paid work placements</u> that are similar to internships, but offer much more support and guidance in the workplace.

What does a placement involve?

Your work experience placement is an opportunity to learn about the world of work, explore the different areas of the company, interview staff and get your hands dirty. You might be given tasks ranging from the day-to-day of answering phones, imputing data, or distributing mail, to industry specific projects.

Remember that you should always:

- **Be professional** follow dress codes, be punctual and be open-minded. Remember there is nothing wrong in offering to make a cup of tea for someone else.
- **Be enthusiastic** show interest, even if the job is repetitive. This will go a long way in the eyes of the employer.
- Ask questions not just to clarify instructions, but also about the company and the roles that interest you. Make the most of your time at the company.
- **Keep a log** write down what you accomplish during the day, what you have learnt, what you found interesting, and if you have anything you need to clarify with your mentor.
- Write down instructions and tasks this will help you keep track of your tasks and to stay organised, plus it will give you a sense of achievement when you tick them off.

Looking ahead to university and beyond

The higher the number of work placements you do, the better prepared you will be for employment. Also remember that some university courses will require specific work experience, for example Medicine, Dentistry, Veterinary Sciences, and other medical professions.

It might also strengthen your university application if you have chosen to apply for a subject that is not closely related the subjects you have studied at school.

After your placement

Make sure that you send a thank you card or email as a matter of courtesy.

Take time to think about what you did over the past week, the pros and the cons, what was your favourite part, and any other reflections. Use this to refine your career aspirations and to identify the next role or industry you would like to explore via a work experience placement.

Administration, Business, Office Work And Financial Services

Work Experience

Student Ladder - Banking

The Banking sector offers a wide variety of different roles. The investment banks offer more specialised services and opportunities exist is areas such as corporate finance and sales and trading, while retail banks, such as Lloyds and NatWest, generally deal with individuals and companies.

<u>HSBC</u>

The work experience opportunities are available from June to August. Further information and specific details regarding each opportunity are available on application.

British Airways

BA's Work Experience Programme covers 26 departments and has been awarded a Gold Standard by Fair Train. Each placement runs for five days and students are valued team members.

<u>Santander</u>

You can gain valuable experience by spending a week across various branches and head office sites. There is also a presentation on the different types of work experience opportunities, preparing for interviews and a CV workshop.

HEALTHCARE

Work Experience

Chelsea and Westminster Hospital

Work experience placements at the Chelsea and Westminster Hospital involve a short-term commitment shadowing a doctor, clinician, nurse, allied healthcare professional or non-clinical teams, usually for 3 to 5 days during the week. Activities can include the opportunity to observe clinical care on the wards, view procedures, visit outpatient clinics and attend multidisciplinary meetings.

- 16+ years old—can attend medical departments, wards/clinics
- 17+ years old—can observe in adult theatres/surgery departments/Emergency Department (adult branch)
- 18+ years old—suitable for paediatrics areas including paediatric theatres, obstetrics, gynaecology and maternity placements, Emergency Department (Paediatric branch)

Student Ladder – Medicine/Dentistry

Most medical & dental schools require you to have some relevant work experience. Because it is so competitive this is now almost compulsory and without it, you will significantly reduce your chances. This should be in a health-related field or any 'caring' setting. Student Ladder gives you a range of suggestions of where you could apply.

NHS Royal Free London

Most work experience attachments are from school students wanting to sample healthcare before considering onward choices about subjects related to medicine. There are many aspects to healthcare from 74 nursing to medicine, management to finance, s7urgery to counselling, catering to pharmacy, transport to security, all of which make up the 24/7 community of carers.

<u>GSK</u>

GlaxoSmithKline Plc is a British multinational pharmaceutical company. They offer work experience programmes for GCSE and A-Level (or equivalent) students at fixed times during the year across a small number of their sites.
