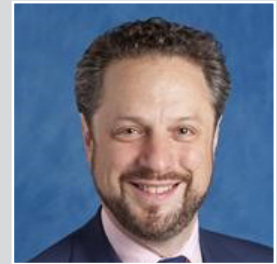
Jonathan Pfitzner

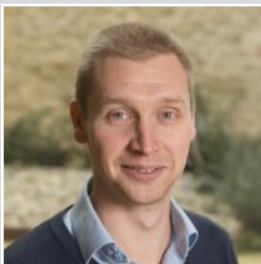
Gaenor Bagley
